MUSIC NOTE – Today's organ voluntaries honor the National Guild of Organists 2012 convention, held in Nashville this last week. The opening voluntary is an example of AGO's efforts to advance the use of the organ in church and concert settings through commissioned works and competitions. Bernard Sanders was the recipient of this award for the 2008 Organ Spectacular. Sanders (born 1957) is a native of DePere, Wisconsin and is full-time music director at the parishes of St. Gallus and Mary Queen of Heaven in Tuttlingen, Germany. Craig Phillips (born 1961), a native Nashvillian, is the American Guild of Organists Distinguished Composer for 2012. He currently serves as Director of Music at All Saints' Church, Beverly Hills.

Guests can find assistance in locating a class for your child at the Welcome Desk in the Children's Ministry Wing (Ages 3-6) and at the Welcome Cart at the top of C-Wing in Oak Hill School (children entering 1st-6th grades). Nursery care for children 6 weeks to age 3 is available during both worship services and Sunday School. Check-in at the Welcome Desk in the Children's Ministry Wing.

MOTHER AND INFANT QUIET ROOM — Mothers of infants who need a quiet place for nursing or calming babies are welcome to use the Quiet Room. An audio feed of the worship service is provided. Check in with Karen Fitts in the Nursery to see if the Quiet Room is available for your use.




