This is our story. It shows how the varying components of our budget contribute to our community of faith being able to live into our God given vision. Every dollar is linked to mission and every gift to faithful expression of the joy of giving and generosity of our God.

PERFORMING & CARRYING OUT OUR MISSION Mission = 33.4 % of the total budget

Our congregation's work extends far beyond our own community, but goes from our doorsteps to the ends of the earth. We have relationships and provided resources to 36 local mission partners that enable mission within our neighborhoods. Our reach extends beyond Nashville to eight National Mission Partner Organizations, ten International Mission Parner Organizations. This has our church reaching 15 countries other than the United States. Within this budget, we will also be sending youth and adults on Mission trips all over the world.

EQUIPPING & MAINTAINING OUR BUILDINGS Property = 27% of the total budget

Our Property staff keeps our facilities clean and in good order so that may perform the work that God is calling us to do. Groups in our local community use our facilities including Oak Hill School, Room in the Inn, Middle Tennessee Presbytery, Martha O'Bryan Center, Overton High School Young Life, Nashville Symphony Orchestra, and Boy Scouts of America. Our worship space, rooms for meetings, offices that provide room for performing the administrative framework that supports our various ministries are cared for in this resource area. Utilities, insurance, taxes and related costs to providing facilities to carry on our work. Our church bookstore and food services are also included here.

EDUCATING OUR CHILDREN, YOUTH AND ADULTS Education = 17% of the total budget

Christian education feeds the soul and the mind: it transmits moral character as well as facts. We have over 2100 children and adults in Sunday School. Our Adult Education, Childrens, and Youth Ministry Sunday School, Bible study and small group curriculum materials and other supplies. It also includes pastor continuing education, Sunday School teacher training, Vacation Bible School, and Nursery Care.

PREPARING FOR CONDUCTING WORSHIP Worship = 11.5% of the total budget

Worship is central to our congregation's work. We have 4300 members at First Presbyterian Church with over 3000 worshippers at our Easter service, over 1200 worshippers at our Christmas Eve Family Service, and an average of 900 worshipping on Sundays. It is the joy and calling of Christians to profess their faith publicly, and we present on average 50 children for the sacrament of Baptism each year. There is immense planning and preparing for three Sunday worship services, holiday services, weddings, funerals, and other special services. Our Music Ministry consults with pastors, selects music, plans and conduct choir rehearsals and practices and researches new music to introduce to the congregation. This category includes costs for music, concerts, special music programs, bulletins, candles, communion supplies, and seasonal Sanctuary decorations.

CREATING COMMUNITY Communications & Special Events = 6.5% of the total budget

Our communications keep us informed and connect our congregation. Our First Edition monthly newsletter, Parish News weekly e-newsletter, church website, ministry e-newsletters, and special events like the Christmas Tree Lighting enable us to sustain our common life together.

CARING FOR OUR CHURCH FAMILY Congregational Care = 4.6% of the total budget

Pastoral care is a vial part of our work, especially for members who are ill, hospitalized, bereaved, preparing for marriage, going through divorce, or facing other crises. Our church provides and other services to members such as at-home communion, delivery of flowers, and Stephen Ministry. We also offer an Inquirers Class for potential new members to understand the history of our church and inquire about becoming a
