#### LITANY OF RESURRECTION HOPE

Pastor: Eternal God, your Word declares that the life that is laid down in faith will be raised and produce

a great harvest. This we celebrate as we proclaim:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pastor: We remember and praise you for the saints and martyrs of this and every age. We name them

before you now [aloud and in silence]. These lives, like seeds, dropped to the ground, yet their

witness has borne fruit and enables us to say:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pastor: We pray for your church throughout the world and for that part to which we belong, that it may

be ready to spend and to be spent in your service, that the love of self-preservation may be set aside, that the deaths you demand of it may be embraced joyfully, and that through all it may

roclaim:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Pastor: In silence we surrender to your will and purpose ourselves and all that we count important. For

we cannot know the glory of Christ's resurrection if we do not have the fellowship of sufferings. And we cannot expect to gather the kingdom's harvest if we do not sow the kingdom's seed. In

us and through us, may your Spirit proclaim:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

### \*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH | from the Westminster Confession of Faith

All saints—who are united to Jesus Christ their head by his Spirit and by faith—have fellowship with him in his grace, sufferings, death, resurrection, and glory. And, being united to one another in love, they participate in each other's gifts and graces and are obligated to perform those public and private duties that lead to their mutual good, both inwardly and outwardly.

It is the duty of professing saints to maintain a holy fellowship and communion in the worship of God, and in performing such other spiritual services as help them to edify one another. It is their duty also to come to the aid of one another in material things according to their various abilities and necessities. As God affords opportunity, this communion is to be extended to all those in every place who call on the name of the Lord Jesus.

## SCRIPTURE READING | Romans 6:1–11 (page 942)

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? <sup>2</sup> By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? <sup>3</sup> Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? <sup>4</sup> We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. <sup>5</sup> For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. <sup>6</sup> We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. <sup>7</sup> For one who has died has been set free from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. <sup>9</sup> We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. <sup>10</sup> For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. <sup>11</sup> So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.
