

For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ And while they still disbelieved for joy and were marveling, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate before them. ⁴⁴ Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." ⁴⁵ Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, ⁴⁶ and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, ⁴⁷ and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. ⁴⁸ You are witnesses of these things. ⁴⁹ And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."

Guest Preacher Dr. Jim Miller *April 21* | *8:30 & 11:00 a.m.*

Dr. James David Miller, a history graduate of Wheaton College in Illinois and a recipient of a Master of Divinity degree from Princeton Theological Seminary, began his pastoral journey in 1981 at Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis. After serving as an adjunct professor of Greek at Wheaton College, Dr. Miller and his wife, Diane, left for Edinburgh, Scotland where he began Ph.D. work in New Testament studies at the University of Edinburgh.

Upon completing his doctorate, Dr. Miller returned to Second Presbyterian Church in Indianapolis, where he served as Theologian in Residence and Associate Pastor for Adult Education until 1992. He then accepted a call to First Presbyterian Church of Tulsa, Oklahoma, preaching his Candidate's sermon on August 23, 1992, and commencing his tenure on October 1 of that year.

Under his pastoral leadership from 1992-2023, the First Presbyterian Church of Tulsa became a vibrant part of the community, witnessing the renovation and dedication of three buildings and the initiation of numerous ministries and mission projects. Dr. Miller's leadership impacted generations of Tulsans, fostering growth in worship, music ministries and discipleship programs while encouraging the spread of Christ's love and promoting the common good within the community. Dr. Miller retired as pastor on October 29, 2023, and continues to write, teach and lecture on his favorite topics.

On Sunday, April 21, Dr. Miller will join us in worship at the 8:30 and 11:00 services. He will also be teaching in the Jones Session Room during the Education Hour. Join us as we welcome Dr. Miller!
