# My Dear Friends,

In New York City, at Sixth Avenue and 20th Street, there is a hot new shopping spot where high end clothing for men and women, home furnishings, expensive children's toys, imported leather goods and even gourmet foods can be purchased, all in the same building. It is called Limelight Marketplace, and it was featured in

a recent edition of *Town and Country Magazine*. What is interesting to me about the place is that all of these shops, some 60 in number, are housed in a building that used to be an Episcopal Church. The Gothic arches are still very much in place, the rose window is elegant and exquisite, and the black and white marble squared floors are all polished and intact, but instead of providing a beautiful sanctuary for the worship and service of God, they all add flavor and style to a hip new group of boutiques where consumers can find whatever their hearts may desire. Between Gothic-styled quatrefoils and winding staircases now are tucked one shop after another.

The article and the pictures of Limelight Marketplace left me wondering. What happened to the church that used to house this congregation? Surely at one time some people deeply committed to Christ and His Church had sacrificed to build this lovely former house of prayer. People of all ages must once have called it their church home. Even as a shopping boutique the stunning beauty of the church is still evident. The neighborhood is a very fashionable one, and I know of at least one vibrant congregation that is housed in this same area in the city. What happened to this once vital church to make it die? Did something dramatic occur to kill it, or did it more likely die a slow, gradual death? Were there points in time where different decisions might have altered the course of its death? At what point did its members lose hope in the future and close the doors of this beautiful church? Did the founders of this lovely church ever envision that one day their beloved congregation would be no more a church at all, but a shopping center?

I rather think that these people, likely long since dead, had no idea that the church they called their religious and spiritual home would one day die, simply cease to be a church at all. They probably were too committed to the way things always were to imagine that they might ever change. Two summers ago we visited Hagia Sophia in Istanbul. It was without a doubt the greatest church in all of Christendom when it was built, and the grandeur and sheer beauty of it still remains. But since 1453, Hagia Sophia has not been a church at all. For almost five hundred years it served as a Mosque, as the Ottomans took over Constantinople and changed the city's name to Istanbul. Since the 1930's, Hagia Sophia has been a museum. The architecture remains decidedly Christian, the beautiful mosaics depict Christian themes and theology, but no one would mistake it for a church. Architecture can help to express the beauty and power of the Gospel, but it takes living people, committed to Christ, to make a church. No people, no church. It is as simple as that.

As we enter another fall season with all of our programs humming at full throttle, let me remind you that it is only the commitment of the people of God to the mission and ministry of the church that gives a congregation its life. We are no more alive as a church family than you are committed to our life and work. Your gifts of time, talent and money, your presence in the worship and service of First Presbyterian Church are the indispensible ingredients that it takes to give us life. "You can not spell church without U!"

So as we enter this busy season of the year, and consider the beauty and grace of our own church buildings and grounds, please pause to reflect again upon your own commitment to the Church of Jesus Christ. We are the oldest worshiping community in the city of Nashville, but that is no guarantee of our future. Your gifts, your commitment, your love for our life and ministry are the only things that will keep us going. Your life in Christ and your love and giving to our church are the only source of life that we have. They are the forces that will keep us breathing, alive and well.

Thank you for your commitment to the life and ministry of First Presbyterian Church. You give us life!

You may not be aware, but FPC now has five young people in seminary preparing for vocational ministry: Jay Howell, Adam DeVries and Trey Wince at Princeton Theological Seminary, and Teddy Christenberry and Courtney Blacksten, who are graduate residents with the Center for Youth Ministry Training (CYMT). Over the course of the year, we will introduce each of these seminarians to our congregation, starting with Teddy Christenberry.

Teddy grew up at FPC, where, as a high school student, he developed the youth ministry's first student-led worship band. Last year, he served as Junior High Youth Director, as well as worship leader for the 5:30 service. This year, he transitions into a new role as our Director of Youth Worship where he is developing youth-led worship teams, in addition to overseeing our high school large group programming and leading our high school small group on Wednesday nights. Teddy has the shortest commute of anyone on staff, living as he does in the Tyne House with a number of other CYMT residents.

Through the Center for Youth Ministry Training, Teddy, along with 32 other young people, takes graduate-level classes at Memphis Theological Seminary and works in ministry 25 hours a week. In addition, he receives weekly one-on-one coaching in ministry and participates in a learning cohort of peers ministering in other congregations. CYMT was co-founded by FPC and Brentwood United Methodist Church in 2006 with the goal of providing specialized theological and practical training for youth ministers. 

# ROOM IN THE INN MINISTRY STARTS NOVEMBER 2

Christ calls us to love and serve others, just as He has loved and served us. First Presbyterian Church seeks to fulfill Christ's commission to aid the hungry, the stranger and the needy in our community by offering an outreach ministry serving the homeless during the coldest months of the year. We participate in this ministry through Room In The Inn, a citywide interfaith agency designed to provide assistance to homeless men and women with needs varying from basic food and shelter to those persons ready to take the step of treatment, job placement and housing. Since 1986, Nashville's homeless have been served by congregations across the city whose volunteers provide hospitality, hope and love all in witness to the amazing power of God's love.



Each Wednesday night during November through March, this congregation faithfully lives out our call to serve others by hosting 14 men on our campus. The men spend the night in the Cannon Center (north side of campus near pool) receiving a hot dinner, an opportunity to launder their clothing, take a hot shower and enjoy the ministry of presence and hospitality from members of the congregation who eat dinner or spend the night with them. Breakfast is provided each morning along with a sack lunch to sustain the men until the next evening's dinner, likely at another Nashville church.

We are ready to resume this ministry to Nashville's homeless on Wednesday nights beginning November 2, and we need you to help us fulfill that commitment. A bulletin board with volunteer opportunities and sign-up spaces may be found in Courtenay Hall. The tasks are varied and most require just a very small time commitment, but the reward of service to those in need is immeasurable. Look over these volunteer roles and choose a date to serve with your family, friends or even a committee or Sunday School class.

# **Volunteer Opportunities for Room In The Inn:**

- **Weekly Captain:** The captain's job is to recruit volunteers to fill the various tasks required for a particular Wednesday night.
- Van Driver: Pick up guests using the FPC bus from Room In The Inn campus on 8th Avenue South, and drive them to FPC; return guests to Room In The Inn Thursday morning.
- **Overnight Hosts:** Two men are needed to spend the night with the guests and prepare a microwave breakfast the next morning.
- **Breakfast and Lunch Food:** Donate assembled sandwiches and soft fruit for lunches and also microwave-ready breakfast food.
- Laundry: Wash bed linens, towels and washcloths used by the guests and return to the Cannon Center by the following Monday.
- Dinner Food: Dinners are provided most nights by FPC, however, volunteers are needed to prepare dinners on selected Wednesday nights when there is no meal service at FPC. This year those nights include November 23 (before Thanksgiving), December 21, December 28, January 4 and March 21 (Spring Break). Plan on enough food to serve 18–20 people including extra helpings for the guests and FPC volunteers.
