MUSIC MINISTRY

■ **MUSIC NOTES** — Our opening hymn, set to the tune Darwall, was written by Canadian Margaret Clarkson in 1946. It is full of biblical phrases from the New Testament. The stanzas are structured around John 14:6, “Jesus answered, ‘I am the way the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.’” It is a hymn of praise to Christ, who is the source of our life (st. 1), the Way (st. 2), the Truth (st. 3), the life (st. 4), and the one we worship as Savior and King (st. 5).

■ **WEDNESDAY CONCERT** — FPC’s organist, Peter Rogahn, will be presenting an organ concert at Scarritt Bennett Center’s Wightman Chapel. Wednesday, March 11, from 12:30 P.M. to 1:00 P.M. The address is 1027 18th Avenue South, Nashville, TN 37212.

Nashville members of The American Guild of Organists (AGO) are presenting these concerts in Wightman Chapel as a gift to the community during Lent. The American Guild of Organists is the national professional association serving the organ and choral music fields. The Guild serves approximately 15,000 members in approximately 300 chapters throughout the United States and abroad. Founded in 1896 as both an educational and service organization, the Guild seeks to set and maintain high musical standards and to promote understanding and appreciation of all aspects of organ and choral music.

■ **CONCORDIA CHOIR CONCERT** — The Concordia Choir of Moorhead, Minnesota will perform at FPC on Friday, March 13, at 7:00 P.M. in the Sanctuary. The Concordia Choir continues to affirm its reputation as one of America’s finest a cappella choirs. Since 1920, the 73-voice choir has performed in nearly every major hall, including Carnegie Hall and Kennedy Center, as well as numerous international tours. A February 2010 performance and recording session with the Grammy Award-winning King’s Singers and multiple performances on Garrison Keillor’s Prairie Home Companion radio show highlight the Choir’s world-class quality. In May 2017 the Choir toured Germany and Austria in celebration of the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation.

Dr. René Clausen is the third conductor in the choir's illustrious history, assuming the role in 1986. As a composer, he has written more than 120 commissioned works. The Kansas City Chorale recording "Life and Breath: Choral Works by René Clausen" won two Grammy Awards in 2013. The 2020 tour will be Dr. Clausen's 34th and final tour with The Concordia Choir. 2020's National Tour of the Southeast spans 15 days and includes locations between Miami and St. Paul. The concert is free and open to the public.
